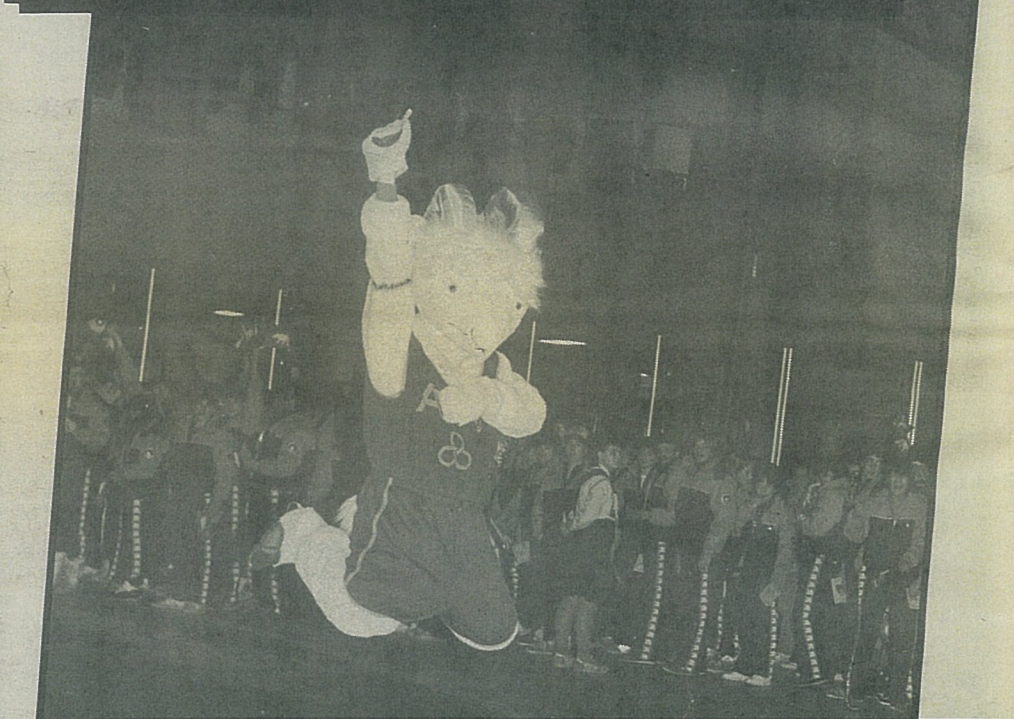

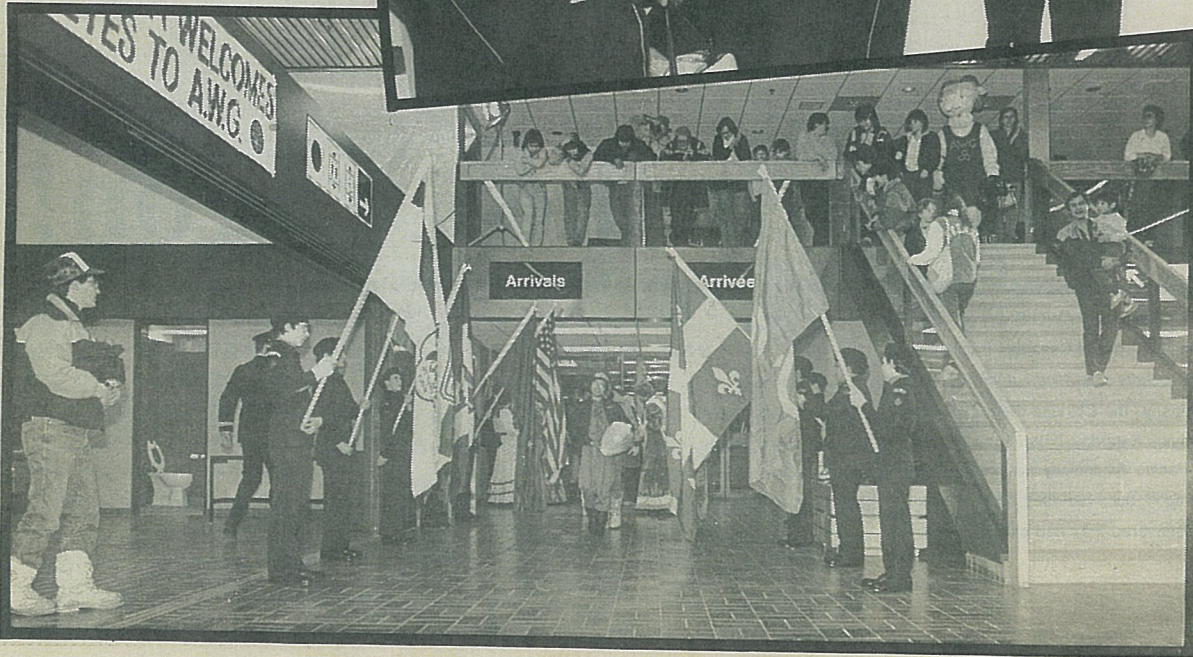

Canadian Pacific Air initially had refused to transport the Dragon, but when they checked their records they discovered they had carried a lot of



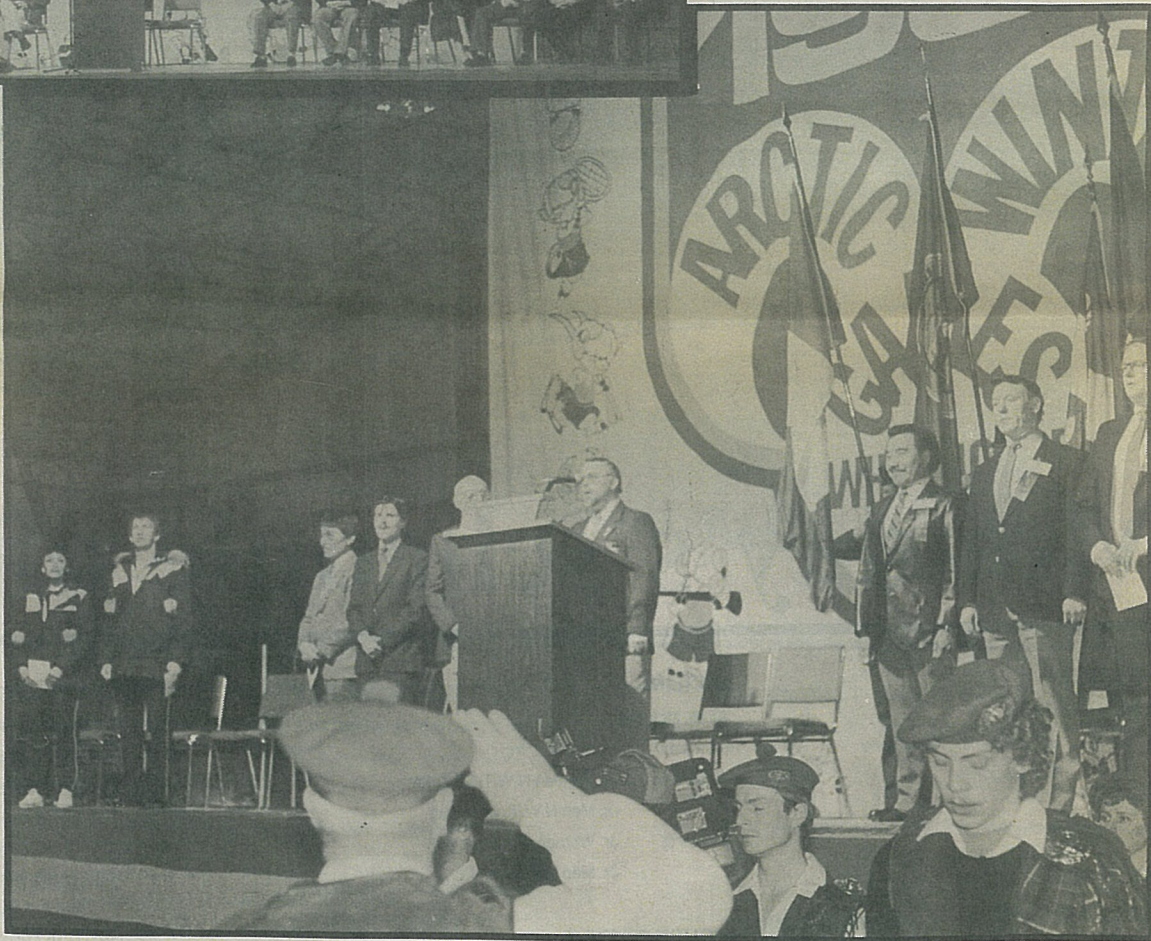
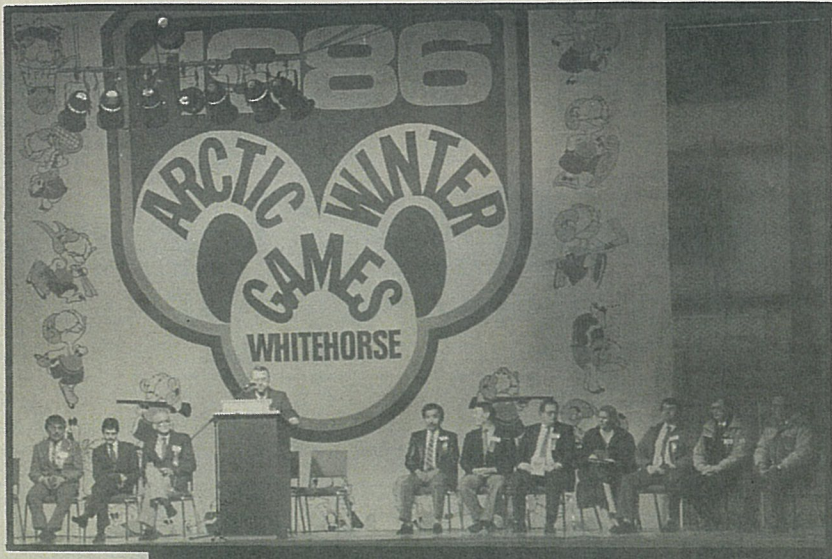
monsters to attend George Arcand's softball tournaments so one more wouldn't hurt.

A special committee has been formed to look after the Dragon until the Games. The Management Committee for Dragon Location and Training, will be affectionately called the McDLT.

Feeding and housing the Dragon will be the major concerns of the McDLT Committee. Fire-breathing dragons, unlike most reptiles, are carnivores and have a liking for humans. Their regular diet is people who have a strong smoke

odour; politicians, preferably older ones. It is not known if this is because politicians frequent smoke-filled rooms or that they just blow a lot of smoke. The committee will not be offering meals to the Dragon, it will have to fend for itself.

Housing the Dragon is the responsibility of the McDLT and numerous sites have been considered. and fumes. Mr. Phelps claims to have stopped smoking cigars but dragons are sometimes slow to pick up on the latest news.

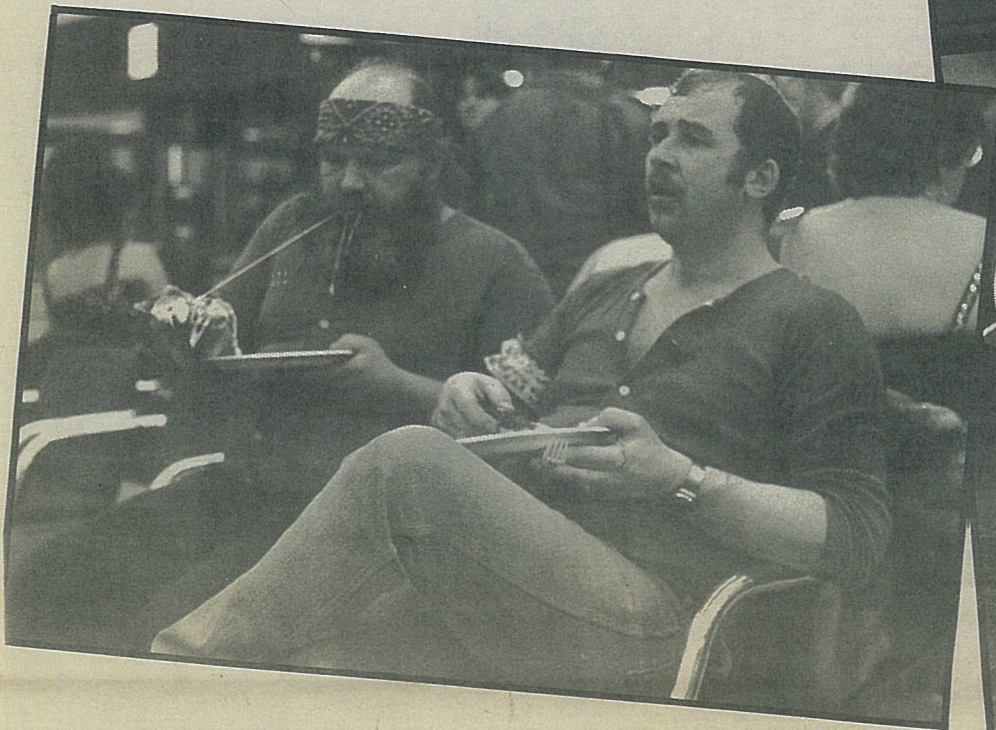
Only male dragons breathe fire. Females make a lot more noise and just smoke a lot; usually it comes out their ears.

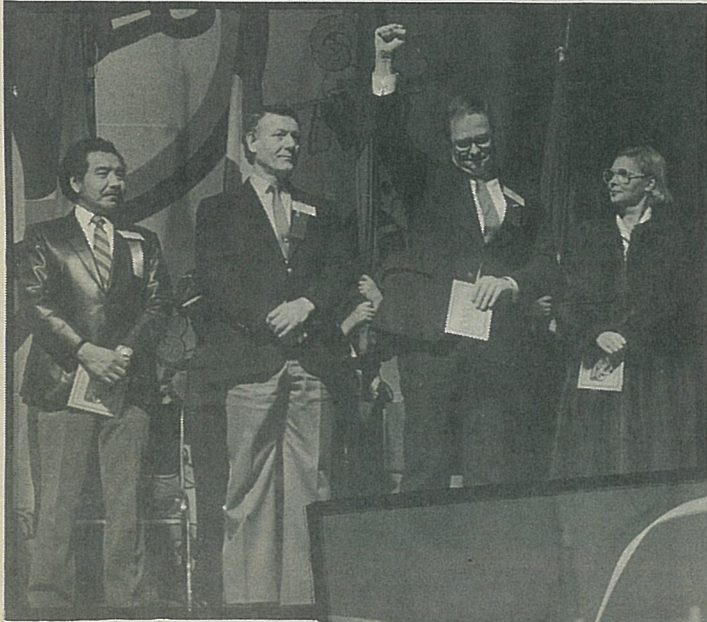
