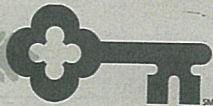

Chez Chugiak serves food

French toast, coffee cake, veggie burgers, enchilada cheese bake, parmesan chicken with noodles almondine, spinach pilaf, Mexican shepherd's pie.

Sounds like a menu at a fancy restaurant, doesn't it?

Actually, this is a sample of the menu to be served at Chez Chugiak this week.

Chugiak High School's cafeteria will be the site for this temporary restaurant, which caters exclusively to the 1,525 athletes and coaches of the Arctic Winter Games.

The Anchorage School District (ASD) is sponsoring the effort to provide and prepare all the food for the Games' participants.

Betsy Nickels, an ASD employee who is in charge of catering for the huge event, said that the menu selection will be varied.

"(They) might want to go with fish and lighter things, or they might want to get something heavier. The choice will be there," she said.

While the ASD is responsible for providing some paid food servers and workers and for purchasing the food, "no district funds will be used" for the effort, according to Nickels.

The Arctic Winter Games will reimburse the district for all costs incurred, she said.

"It's not costing the district anything at this juncture," Nickels said.

All meals will be served in the cafeteria, except for some lunches, which will need to be transported to athletes and coaches at the outdoor sport sites.

Some other Arctic Winter Games food trivia:

— 20 cases of coffee have already been donated, and "I think we'll go through every bit of that, and probably have to buy more," Nickels said.

— ASD plans to use 200 cases of milk per day

— ASD expects to cook and serve 3,800 burritos in one night

The plan for the district to sponsor the games has been in effect since 1992, with the most intensive planning taking a year or more.

"The school district is really excited about this, and they've done a terrific job," Nickels said.

"It's been quite a venture."

For example, everyone knows the international gesture for "I'm hungry." There are several, actually — you can hold your stomach, pretend to chew something or just point to your mouth.

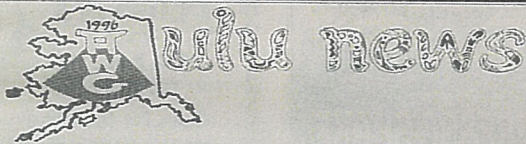
Some people actually go so far as to make themselves an imaginary sandwich or twirl an imaginary noodle before pretending to eat. If you're thirsty too, just take an imagi-

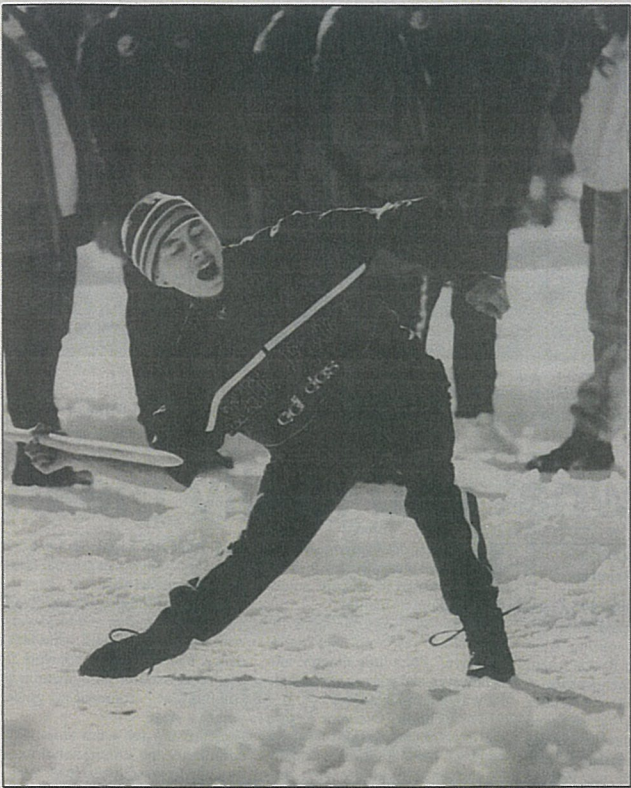

Sportsmanship, Arctic Sports aim

"These games are a part of the survival skills we needed," said "Big Bob" Aiken during the opening ceremonies for the 1996 Arctic Sports competition. "We are still in much use of the games mentally and physically."

Steeped in Native tradition, the opening ceremonies for the popular yet unique sport were dynamic and uplifting.

"These (games) were handed down as an insurance of the younger generation to the old generation that they wouldn't have to worry about their offspring," Aiken said.

"The games that we (the different regions) play are a little different," said Aiken, "but combine them together and make them suitable for the Arctic Winter Games."

And combining together to reach common goals is what Arctic Sports are all about.

"That's the original spirit of these games," said Virginia Thomas, chair of the event. Thomas explained that Arctic Sports were not meant to be competition, but rather a way to promote endurance, agility and personal ability.

"You'll see athletes encouraging each other," Thomas said. She said it's not about winning the overall competition, but rather about bettering personal records.

Team Alaska and Team Northwest Territories know about records. The two teams hold the Arctic Winter Games' records. However, teams from Greenland, Yukon, and Russia will get their names into the record books this year.

Arctic Sports events are taking place at Gruening Middle School. Thomas said the high kick competitions are a favorite among spectators. Arctic Sports has events most of the day every day, winding up on Friday.

'96 Games helped by many people

Many people have joined in over the past half-dozen years to bring the 1996 Arctic Winter Games to Eagle River.

Precisely who was the first person to say "why don't we?" is not known.

It was Alaska's turn to host the biennial Games in 1996, but in 1992 it was learned that Juneau, the city scheduled to host the event, would not be able to provide the required facilities.

Wanting to keep the Games in Alaska, concerned residents presented the suggestion to enter a bid to the Chugiak - Eagle River Board of Directors. The board gave its blessing to the project and Susan Gorski, Executive Director of the Chamber, loaned her continuing assistance to the effort.

The idea of hosting the 1996 Games caught on and snowballed.

An organizing committee headed by John Rodda, Jim Gorski and Chuck Landers was formed to prepare a bid and invited officials of the Arctic Winter Games International Committee to visit the area. That visit was conducted in the Fall of 1992 and shortly thereafter the announcement was made that Chugiak - Eagle River had been selected.

Many of those early supporters are on the current board of directors of the Chugiak - Eagle River Host Society.

They are President John Rodda, Vice President Jim Gorski, Secretary Marianne Defendorf, Treasurer Soren Orley and Directors Merry Braham, Ted Carlson, Gary Creviston, Elizabeth Jenkins, Steve Kalmes, George Newsham, Frank Nosek, Sen. Randy Phillips, Cindy Solbert, Chris Swalling, Chris Spoerhase and Erin Carey Byrne. Ex-officio directors are Mayor Rick Mystem and Assemblyman Dan Kendall.

Dan Sullivan was selected to serve as Executive Director and has provided administrative leadership. Kathi Fink is administrative assistant.

Sports Director is Loren L. Smith, assisted by Lisa Farber.

Sharilyn Mumaw is coordinator of volunteers and special events. More than 2,000 people have offered their time and talent to help with the Games.

First 'Fair Play' pin awarded Monday

Virginia Thomas will go down in Arctic Winter Games history as the first recipient of the new "Fair Play" pin awarded by the International Committee.

Thomas is the chairwoman of the Arctic Sports event. And chairing one of the most unique events of the Games is no easy task, especially when the facility has problems.

Arctic Sports are being held at Gruening

Middle School. The floor in the room most of the events are being held in is tile on concrete, not a very soft landing for athletes who are doing a lot of jumping, kneeling and knuckle hopping, said Ian Legaree, technical director for the International Committee.

"We had some difficulty with the floor at the facility," Legaree said. "We had to do a lot of scrambling around."

Legaree said Thomas "kept her cool" and got everyone back on track.

"I reminded these kids why they were here and about the spirit of the competition," Thomas said, adding that what seemed like a

situation was no situation at all, it was simply handled.

"That's exactly the kind of thing we wanted to reward," Legaree said.

The Fair Play pin was designed to promote the Games' philosophy of sportsmanship and fairness," Legaree said. He said only 300 pins were made and will be distributed by the International Committee throughout the week.

"I was surprised," was all Thomas could say about the pin. That's one pin that probably won't be traded.

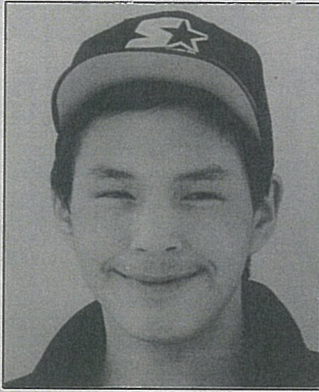

Nathaniel Qaqasiq played table tennis for Team Northwest Territory (NWT) in the 1994 Arctic Winter Games in Slave Lake, Alberta. He was 14. "I wasn't that good. I had a cheap racquet. It just wasn't very good," he said of the experience.

His outlook for the 1996 Games in Chugiak - Eagle River is a completely different story. "I'm just going to try to win," he said yesterday after playing his third match of the Games, a doubles event. His first two were singles and he came out with one win, one loss.

Nathaniel, now 16, is from Pangnirtung, a small town on Baffin Island. In November, he was contacted by the NWT recreation coordinator and asked if he wanted to try out for the 1996 team. He did so in January, flying for an hour to get from his home to the tryout location.

Nathaniel made the team. He also bought himself a racquet. "It cost \$196," he said, his brown eyes framed by arched brows over an incredulous grin.

He's ready to play. But winning will be difficult, he conceded. "Greenland and Tyumen, they're hard," he said. "They're good players."

The NWT team is at a disadvantage over some of the others. "The players and coaches they don't live in the same town, so we don't get to practice together," Nathaniel explained. "I'm learning a lot from the other players," he said of the competition.

"It looks like it's going to be fun," he said.

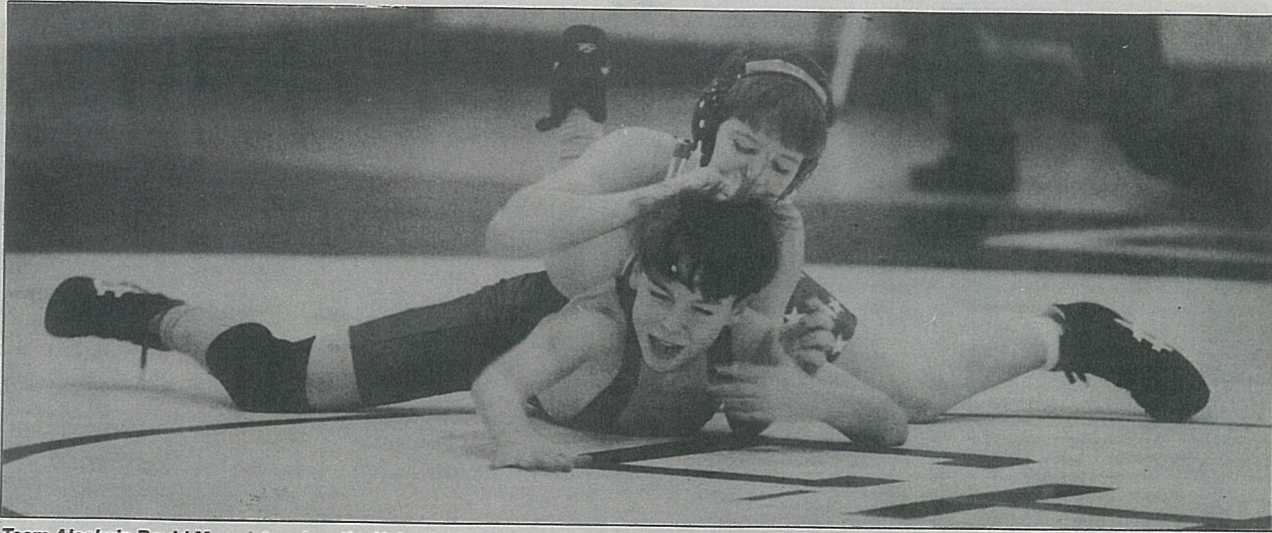

Rule changes slow soccer

A new format and several rule changes appeared to slow Team Alaska in the first day of indoor soccer action Monday at Gruening Middle School.

In the Games' first contest at 9 a.m. between Alaska and Alberta, the two teams drew at 5-5 on a penalty shot by Alberta in the last 2:30 of the second half.

The infraction of the day for Alaska was a defender stepping into the goalie arc, a three-yard halo in front of each goal. As the rule reads, if a defender, other than the goalie, steps into the arc to gain an advantage, the opposing team gets a penalty shot. That penalty shot taken from about 25 feet out is almost a certain goal. Alberta's goaltender Nick Roberts took the penalty shot against Team Alaska netminder Matt Novotney. 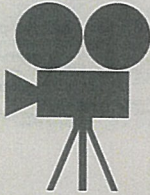
Center will host cultural displays, face painters, a Lionel Train Display and other activities. So come join us in the fun.

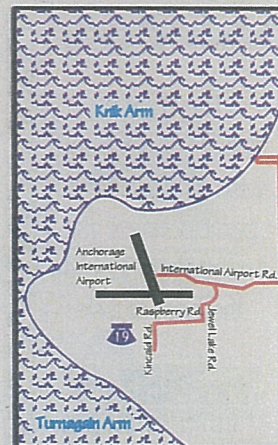

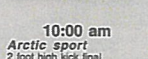



Defending champion Alberta North was referred to as the team to beat.

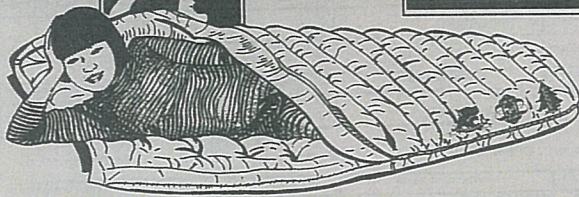
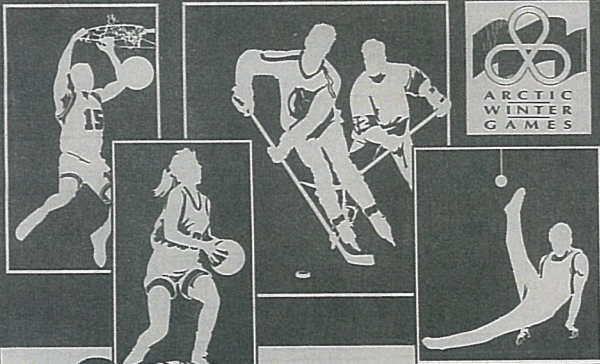
